

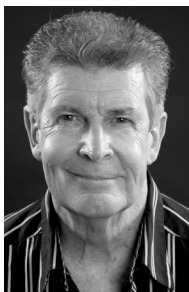
John Higgins was born in Sydney and moved to the US after finishing high school. He began his professional career at the Old Globe Theatre in San Diego, California where he appeared in over sixteen Shakespearean plays over four years.

In 1970 he moved to London where he worked for **The Royal Shakespeare Company**, appeared in the West End production of *The Boys in The Band* and toured to South Africa in *The Mating Game*. In South Africa he also directed extensively including several productions at the legendary Market Theatre, Johannesburg.

As an actor he has appeared in many feature films including: *Patton* with George C. Scott, *The Revolutionary* with Jon Voight and *Major Dundee* with Richard Harris and Charlton Heston. In Australia John appeared in the classic *Phar Lap*. As an Accent Coach he worked on the films, *The Best Little Whorehouse in Texas* and *Steel Magnolias*.

Since his return to Australia, in 2000, he has been in high demand as an Accent Coach. He has worked for The Ensemble on *I Ought To Be In Pictures* and *The Price*; for Company B Belvoir Street on *Suddenly Last Summer*, *The Laramie Project*, *My Zinc Bed*, *Buried Child* and the 2006 Helpmann award winning production of *Stuff Happens*. For the South Australian Theatre Company, Edward Albee's *The Goat: or Who Is Sylvia?* which won the 2006 Helpmann Award for Best Director. His most recent film work in Australia includes *The Quiet American* directed by Phil Noyce, *Dynasty Behind the Scenes* at Fox Studios Australia and *Superman Returns* directed by Bryan Singer. He recently worked as an English Accent coach and Guest Judge on the hit TV series *Australian Princess*.

John has taught at U.C.L.A., The Actor's Centre (London), On Camera Connections, The Ensemble Studios, The Actor's Centre Australia and Screenwise. While John specialises in American dialects he also teaches all dialects for stage and screen including standard and regional British dialects. As an acting teacher he has taught everything from The Method in New York to Shakespeare in London.

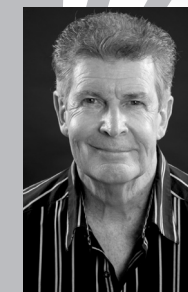

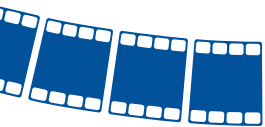
